
Abstract


Introduction

The state, as well as many other public and private universities, have a homeless fee tuition waivers for qualifying students. However, they fail to directly address the initial issue at hand: **housing**. Less than 50% of students applying for the housing fee waiver aid are approved, and studies show that many qualifying youth go without support.


Current FSU Programs, like the Unconquered Scholars Program, also fails to assist the majority of qualifying students. This trend in housing insecurity and lack of aid in response is impacting higher education and a student's ability to fully immerse themselves in their academics.




FAFSA Housing Waiver Eligibility and Aid Recipient Count
