- Editing and reviewing the completed surveys together to check for accuracy



Answers are compared with a partner, and errors are reviewed

- Meeting regularly to review the data collected on female characters



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
Graph 1: Class By Color

Results

- When it comes to female directors, you can see that diversity with skin color between the classes is still a problem. As the upper class has lighter skin tones compared to the lower classes which show having darker tones.
- Out of the almost 500 female characters surveyed the highest number in suffering presented was 18 people in one of the categories.
- The types of suffering presented were shown to be prominent in young adults and adults. Not so much in children or seniors.
- When it comes to the relationships with other women the female director are showing present those relationships.

Discussion

- We currently have no conclusive results, although we have completed over 30% of the films
- Although there are still difficulties, we have noticed that a female director does have an impact on the representation in Bollywood.
- We note common patterns that there are common patterns of how female directors portray their female characters.
